HISTORY OF GOOD SAM AND OVERVIEW OF SERVICES

Established in 1951 by the Episcopal Diocese of West Texas, Good Samaritan Community Services (Good Sam) began as a downtown mission of St. Mark's Episcopal Church under the leadership of Bishop Everett Jones. At the time, the West Side area of San Antonio - where Good Sam's Community Center is located - had the highest incidences of infant death from diarrhea and poor sanitation. In response, Good Sam started building programs to address health and educational disparities in the community. Good Sam has since grown to become a private, nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization and United Way agency that provides comprehensive services to overcome the challenges of poverty to more than 4,700 individuals and 1,800 families in 6 locations around South Texas in FY 2019.

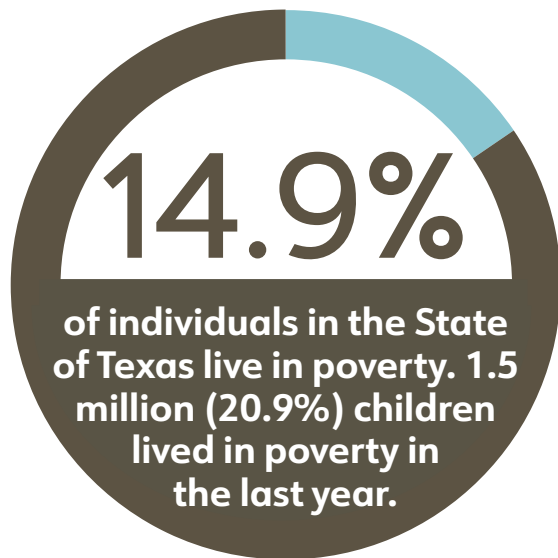

GOOD SAM STATS:

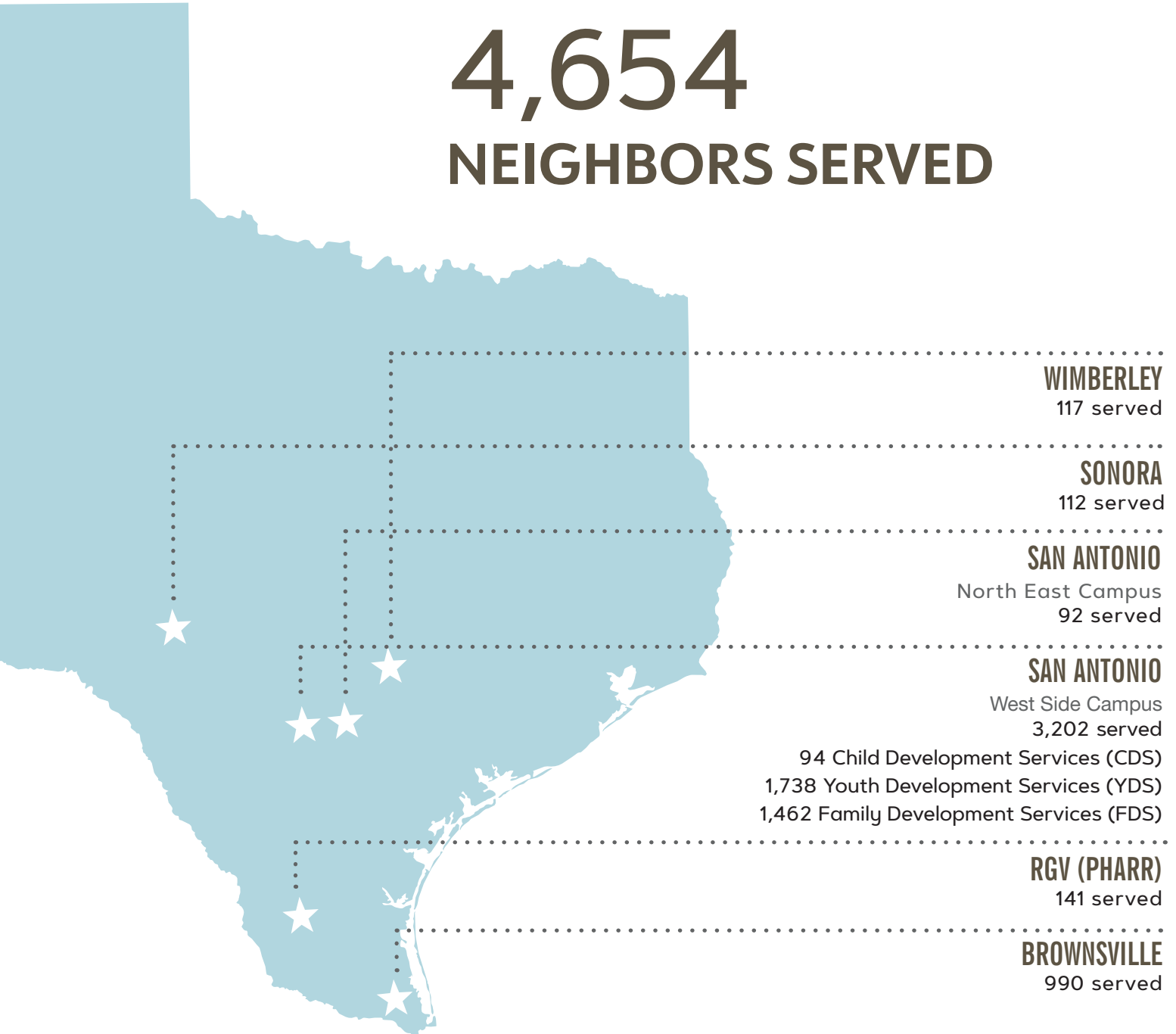
- **73%** of program participants had satisfactory attendance in the 17-18 school year, as compared to 65% of their peers.
- Students participating in afterschool and summer enrichment programming at Good Sam were also more likely to stay in school; while **23%** of their peers were considered to be at risk of dropping out, only **17%** of program participants were at risk. In addition, fewer program participants were chronically absent from school, **9%** as opposed to **13%**.

78207 STATS:

- **93%** of 78207 residents are Hispanic or Latinx.
- Over **50%** of children and youth under the age of 18 live in homes where the head of household is a single mom.
- **40%** of residents live in poverty; **57%** of children residing in the 78207 zip code live in poverty.
- **92%** of students residing in 78207 qualify for free or reduced-price school lunches.
- **46%** of adults over the age of **25** residing in 78207 do not have a high school diploma or equivalent.

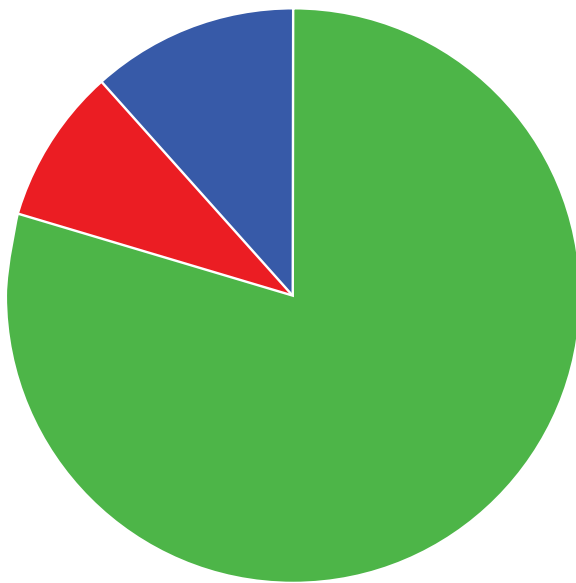

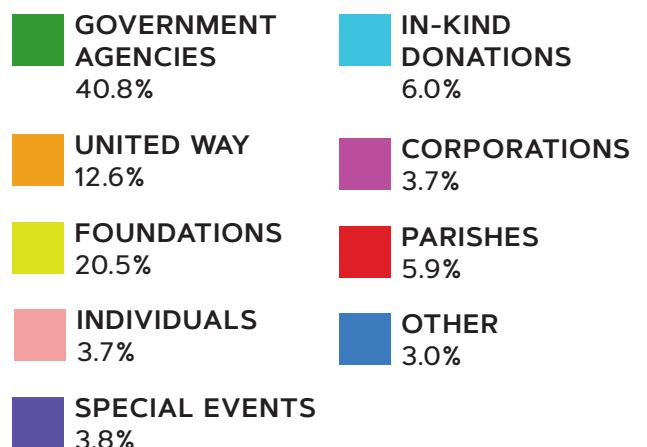

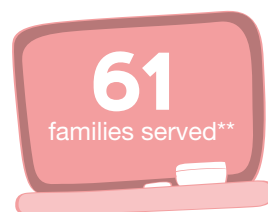

CDS SUCCESS STORY — YESENIA'S STORY

"My name is Yesenia Martinez, and I have three boys - Ray, Matthew, and Junior - who all have attended the Afterschool and Camp Good Sam programs. We have been coming to Good Sam for the last two years, starting off with Matthew attending daycare and then with me being enrolled in the Parents as Teachers (PAT) program. I like coming to Good Sam because I always feel welcome here. I always feel at home and know that my kids are safe. The Center is the heart of the barrio, and we are always treated like family.

The PAT program has helped me as a single mom to grow as a parent. Angels like Ms. Nadia, Tansy, Bridgette and Patsy were like a survival guide for me and were there for me in my struggles being a single mother. They were there for me when I was struggling with depression and trauma from an abusive relationship. They made me aware of resources like the Bridge program and taught me to forgive my past and to go forward with the future to work hard and provide for my kids. I feel strong and independent, and I learned first how to love God, and then how to love myself and others. I've started three businesses, and I know that right now I'm unbreakable. My strength is knowing that my kids are proud of me and that I'm going to give them a better future. I will never forget the people at Good Sam who have been there for me in my struggle, and have always been there to cheer me on and make me feel that I'll be okay. I tell all my friends to go to Good Sam because here you're family. You're at home here."



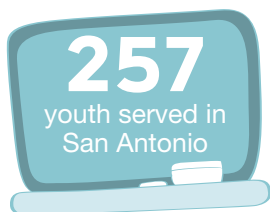

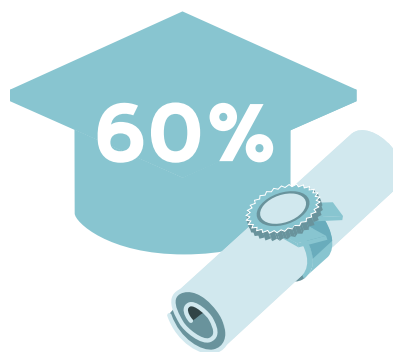

YDS SUCCESS STORY — RAFA'S STORY

Rafael Murillo (Rafa) has been part of the Good Sam community for several years, having participated in Camp Good Sam and Afterschool programs. As a Lanier High School student, he joined Good Sam's College and Career (CCR) program during his freshman year and studied architecture and construction management while in school. He also joined mariachi and played the Vihuela, a 5-string Mexican instrument. He took a leave from the CCR program during his sophomore and junior years to work, until he was recruited by CCR Advisor Jacob Benn in his final year at Lanier. Rafa says, "The CCR program really helped in getting me ready for college, especially in filling out applications and financial aid."

Rafa graduated in 2019 and was awarded Good Sam's Bishop Jones Award. He was accepted with a full ride scholarship from Union College in New York, where he is currently studying mechanical engineering. His dream job is to become an inventor. He says what he misses about home is his family, the culture and food, but is excited about his studies at Union.



SERVING OUR SENIORS: SENIOR CENTER OUTCOMES

Good Sam's Senior Center program is the only nationally accredited senior center in South and Central Texas, and one of only five nationally accredited senior centers in the state. The Senior Center program provides seniors in the 78207 and surrounding zip codes with comprehensive services that support their overall health and wellness. Seniors participate in activities that reduce social isolation and increase physical mobility, and have access to routine wellness services. The program operates year-round, Monday through Friday, from 9:00 am to 2:00 pm, and is offered to participants at no cost.

CATALINA'S STORY

"I worked at Kelly Air Force Base for 25 years, first as a data transcriber and later as a computer operator, before the base closed. I was offered to transfer to Colorado but decided to retire and stay close to home near my daughters and grandkids. I first came to Good Sam in 2009 after I retired when I used to come to my grandson's meetings for the youth program. Jill Oettinger, the CEO at the time, told me I was eligible to join the Senior Center so that's when I joined. Before joining the senior program, I used to just sit at home. I was 59 at the time, and now I'm 68.

I like coming to Good Sam for all the new friends I've met since I came and all the new friends I continue to make. The Senior program has helped me grow and helped me maintain myself. I was diagnosed as bipolar, and all the counselors here have helped me and taken a lot off of my shoulders, especially talking to Liz and Ellie.

Before I came to Good Sam, I felt I could not do a lot of things but now I feel like I'm doing a lot of good things here. What keeps me going is the Center and my grandkids - I have eight total. I love sewing and have made aprons here for Christmas, but gardening is my baby right now. I love to work in the garden here at Good Sam and help the plants grow and keep the garden maintained. I want everyone who comes to Good Sam to see it and feel welcome here."
