November was such a busy month here at Good Sam!

Alongside the Ghost Town Survivors, we co-hosted a Veterans Day celebration honoring all the men and women who served in the armed services. We welcomed Major General Juan Ayala, United States Marine Corps (retired) and current Director of Military and Veteran's Affairs in SA, as our keynote speaker.

Mr. Ayala, a native of El Paso, delivered a powerful message to over 80 veterans, including 25 Purple Heart recipients, in attendance, going as far back as the Vietnam War.

Our Brownville staff list is now complete again! Our new additions to the team are **Abdiel de Hoyos**, our VEX PT instructor, and **Karyme Quinonez**, our dance PT instructor. Welcome to the Good Sam team!

This month, we partnered with agencies at the HEB 31st Annual Feast of Sharing to prepare over **1,000 plates** for the entire community.

We also partnered with Raising Cane's, Fays provided students with school uniforms, and we collaborated with the Brownsville Community Health Center (BCHC) for their ¡Vive Tu Vida! Get Up! Get Moving! event at Glady's Porter Zoo.

For Giving Tuesday, Good Sam hosted Barrio Loteria open to the community. Families joined us for a friendly game of Loteria as we raised \$4,241.00 through 25 donors and 18 businesses!



Family Development Services

Our food pantry has been serving our community for over a year now! We currently average over 60 families who are food insecure monthly. Our team is focused on

addressing food insecurity needs among the Westside community and collaborating on several coalitions to address these issues city-wide.

We have begun a capacity-building cohort with the SA Area Foundation as part of the PaCE Health Equity Cohort Grant. Our team is also participating in S.A. Metropolitan Health Departments' Policy and Civic Engagement Offices' Health Equity Network on Food Insecurity and in partnership with United Way of San Antonio Safety Net Impact Council on Food Insecurity.

In the previous year, we made an impact by providing food assistance to **810 individuals**, exceeding our first-year goal of 500! In addition to immediate food needs, we offer referral services, enroll clients in Good Sam programs, and assist with crises as appropriate.

We are accepting community applications for the annual Holiday Bag and turkey voucher drive this December. We hope to receive enough donations to serve all community members in need.


Youth & Teen Services


