Brownsville Campus Spotlight

Brownsville campus staff represented Good Sam at the Consulado de Mexico on September 1st, along with other community partners. The event was focused on labor rights and help in the community for families who work. Noticias de Mexico y el Mundo interviewed staff.

ABC instructors started services at Stell Middle School with 6-8th grade, 4th and 5th grade at Skinner Elementary, and VEX at Martin Elementary for grades 2nd through 5th. We

now meet with parents every Tuesday since they have shown great interest in our program!



We had our first Youth Action Committee (YAC) meeting on September 6th, with 20 students happy to be back and registered once again. English as a Second Language classes are now offered for parents coming to drop off their children for YAC.

YAC students are excited about this new fiscal year as they have voiced their need for more homework/study sessions together. The first homework help/study session took place, and families had the first 30 minutes to eat snacks and catch up with each other.



Family Development Services

The Good Samaritan Food Pantry re-opened in the fall of 2022 and is located in the Senior Center. The Senior Center team, staff and interns work with an Immediate Assistance Specialist to ensure a well-organized program is in place to serve anyone in need. We provide access to healthy food distribution in high-need areas (food deserts and /or programs servicing children, older adults, people with disabilities and other vulnerable populations). Services include emergency food assistance, crisis recognition and referrals, and access to basic hygiene and/or newborn child supplies.

Since we have only reopened the food pantry a year ago, we are still working on outreach efforts to let the community know we are available to assist. Challenges will be staffing and the ability to serve scheduled and walk-in clients. We depend heavily on social work interns each semester, as they have the ability to provide service hours and assist with food pantry registrations, food distributions, and immediate assistance for referrals. Working to stock and organize the food pantry and distributing monthly Project Hope and Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) boxes is a task requiring physical labor. In addition, being knowledgeable of local community partners, resources/social services, and food pantries to assist client is a necessity.



Indicators of success:

During the first year of the Food Pantry, we served 810 unduplicated clients with food needs. The food pantry/immediate assistance is funded through United Way of SA Safety Net.

The Senior Center served 220 older adult clients through the Senior Nutrition Program which provides a hot lunch from Meals on Wheels, Adult Case Management, and/or Project Hope and CSFP food distributions monthly from the SA Food Bank.

The Child Development Center-La Escuelita Early Childhood Program served 53 children with food assistance from the SA Food Bank with two hot meals (breakfast and lunch) and one snack daily.

The Youth Development Services program served 181 OST students and 175 Camp Good Sam (summer program) students with hot meals and a snack from the SA Food Bank.

Our Family Services Team is happy to recognize September as Hunger Action Awareness Month.
