MISSION STATEMENT

Our Mission is: "to serve as a catalyst for change, supporting youth, individuals, and families by providing excellent community services to overcome economic poverty". Guided by our mission, our Vision has evolved over the years - we "Empower Communities To Thrive".

Founded by the Episcopal Diocese of West Texas in 1951 to serve a community known then as the "Death Triangle", Good Samaritan's early focus was to improve the health and education outcomes of the growing West Side neighborhood surrounding the corner of West 19th and Saltillo Streets.

Today, we still focus on our neighbors' health and educational needs with specialized programs that serve infants, children, individuals, and families. We create value for our neighbors and the stakeholders that support our services because we are community-based, serve community-driven educational opportunities and needs, and focus on outcomes that increase access to economic stability for individuals and families.

FAMILY DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

Good Samaritan is a nonprofit organization, United Way agency, and neighborhood anchor providing comprehensive services to over 3,500 low-income individuals annually and has been a primary social service resource for residents of the near-west side of San Antonio, for more than seven decades.

The comprehensive services provided by Good Sam through its early intervention programs for infants, children and youth have helped individuals and families break the cycle of poverty in San Antonio's most historically underserved zip code for decades. Our holistic approach to serving families begins by assessing the needs of every person in a family from infants to children to youth, to parents and grandparents and aligning needs to resources

This one-stop-shop direct service and referral approach allows us to be agile in meeting client's needs, whether on our main campus or via a referral. Participants serviced by our Family Development Services Department are supported by one or more of the following programs:

Child Development Services

- Good Sam's Early Head Start programs serves infants 6 weeks 18
 Months (AVANCE as a primary partner).
- La Escuelita Early Learning Program serves children from 18 months 5 years.
- Parents as Teachers Home visiting program supports parents prenatally and with children & infants 5 years old.

Family Development Services

- Senior Center hosts a Social Interventional program for Older adults and wellness services such as a Senior Nutrition Program for adults 60 years old and above.
- Adult Programming & Education promotes parent education. Food Security, feeding individuals and families in partnership with the San Antonio Food Bank and Meals on Wheels.
- Emergency Food Pantry services are offered to reduce food insecurity.





Parents as Teachers

Desiree is a single mother who found a network of support when she enrolled her two children in Good Sam's, Early Head Start Program, in January 2021. Working full-time and raising two young children comes with its challenges when trying to find the best early childhood education program. Like many parents she was trying to find a balance, when she was invited to join the Parents as Teachers (PAT) Program. The PAT program supports Desiree in multiple ways, including monthly visits from her Parent Educator, Rebekah. Together, they work on activities for the children and explore positive parenting techniques, that have helped Desiree create a nurturing, self-aware environment at home.


Through the PAT Program, Desiree has learned how to help her children develop their motor and social skills, emotional resilience, and increase their preschool readiness. Good Sam has given Desiree the tools to break generational cycles and rewrite her future, and the ability to raise resilient, confident children. She encourages other parents to join the PAT program, not only for the child's development but for the immense support and village that makes you feel welcome.



Senior Center

At 74, Maria found herself feeling isolated after retiring from her career as a medical billing professional. Having lost her husband and with her children having moved away, Maria struggled with loneliness and depression. But everything changed when she joined the Good Samaritan Senior Center in 2010. Here, she found a welcoming community full of life, support, and activities like yoga, Zumba, and Tai Chi. She even started a knitting class to make hats for hospital patients. Most importantly, Maria found where she belongs - a place that gives her purpose and joy.

"I'm grateful to have a safe place to meet people and stay active and busy. Life can be hard when you grow old and feel no one likes you anymore. Good Sam makes us feel like we belong and still have a purpose."



YOUTH AND TEEN SERVICES

Good Sam is a catalyst for change, supporting youth, individuals, and families by providing excellent community services to overcome economic poverty. Another resource we offer to the children and youth in our community is provided by our Youth and Teens Services Department, which serves youth between the ages of 6 and 18.

We recognize that children and youth are the most important part of our future community, and our goal is to help them acquire the life and academic skills necessary for personal success. Since Good Sam's inception, our goal has always been to provide a healthy and safe environment. Today, we have expanded to offer programs that foster growth and development through three areas of focus, (1) Support Educational Achievement, (2) Encourage Healthy Decisions, and (3) Engage Families through the Raising Highly Capable Kids curriculum which utilizes the Search Institute's Family Assets Framework.

Students in San Antonio and Brownsville have the opportunity to become involved with the following:

In-School Services

- Asset Building for Clients includes weekly lessons and activities promoting personal growth.
- College and Career Readiness support youths' transition into post-secondary education or the workforce.

Out-of-School Services

- After-school programming is an academic support program for children 6 18 years old, to include Youth Case Management.
- Youth Advisory Committee serves as a platform for youth to explore their interest, find their voice and contribute to their community.
- Camp Good Sam is a six week summer learning program at our Brownsville and San Antonio campuses.







COMMUNITY IMPACT

This past year, we provided comprehensive services to 3,622 individuals and 1,100 families in San Antonio and South Texas


3,622 Individuals Served







CLIENT DEMOGRAPHIC IMPACT

ETHNICITY




